<u>Geoffrey Hodgson</u> is Research Professor in Business Studies at the University of Hertfordshire, Editor-in-Chief of the Journal of Institutional Economics. He has authored over 15 books, over 130 articles in academic journals, and over 80 articles in academic books. His principal fields of academic interest are institutional economics, evolutionary economics, the methodology of economics, the history of economic thought, and social theory. He is the Secretary of the World Interdisciplinary Network for Institutional Research (WINIR) Institutions





<u>Tine De Moor</u> is professor on Institutions for Collective Action in Historical Perspective at the department for social and economic history of Utrecht University. She is co-founder of the International Journal of the Commons and president of the Executive council of the International Association for the Study of the Commons. De Moor is currently involved in several projects on institutions for collective action. She has published extensively in academic journals and has traced the historical origins of Harding's metaphor *The Tragedy of the Commons*.

Bart Nooteboom is Emeritus Professor of innovation policy of Tilburg University. His research interests include innovation, entrepreneurship, organizational learning, interfirm collaboration, and trust. In recent years he has refocused on reading and writing on philosophy all my life. He has published thirteen books and 350 papers. He is a member of the Royal Netherlands Academy of Arts and Sciences, and was awarded the Kapp prize (1996), the Gunnar Myrdal prize (2004) and the Schumpeter prize (2009) for his work on organizational learning, on trust and innovation
