Dr Juliet Hunt, Independent Consultant on Gender and Development

Juliet is an advocate for gender equality and human rights. She has worked in the overseas development sector since 1978, focusing on gender equality, violence against women, gender auditing/self-assessment and organisational change, and research on gender issues.

Juliet has worked closely with several local non-government organisations in the Pacific and in other regions, as well as with bilateral and multilateral agencies and INGOs. She has worked for many years with the Fiji Women's Crisis Centre and the Vanuatu Women's Centre as an adviser, including on their national prevalence studies on violence against women and their program design, monitoring and evaluation. She has also worked with the Tonga Women and Children Crisis Centre.

Juliet has undertaken several reviews on gender equality, including for the Development Assistance Committee of the OECD, the Asian Development Bank's two rounds of rapid gender assessments, Oxfam Australia's gender impact study in Sri Lanka, and their gender and protection study, also in Sri Lanka.

In 2000, Juliet was awarded a Churchill Fellowship to research good practice on gender equality programming and gender auditing in several countries. In 2006/2007 she worked with AusAID on their gender equality policy. In 2013 she developed the Asian Development Bank's Toolkit on Gender Equality Results and Indicators. She has worked with several organisations to develop and implement gender auditing methodologies, including Oxfam Australia, Caritas Australia, Plan International Australia, CARE Australia and the Australian Council for International Development. She has designed and undertaken gender training with a range of different stakeholders including local women's organisations and development workers INGOs and AusAID.

Juliet's most recent research project was the Zimbabwe Gender Equality and Change study, undertaken in collaboration with Plan International Australia and funded by Plan Australia and Plan Germany. She has a number of publications on gender equality issues in development.
