#### 1. <u>Course synopsis</u>

The Internationalisation of Education programme welcomes you to the second Teaching in the International Classroom workshop on November 8 and 9, 2017. While most internationalisation of education trainings are centred on intercultural competence skills, EUR focuses on giving teachers ownership over the internationalisation process by rethinking its premises. This means engaging fully with what it means to be international in a globalized world while staying rooted in the city of Rotterdam.

The workshop will be run by Dr. Ginie Servant-Miklos (EUC) and Dr. Tim de Mey (Philosophy) and like last year, will focus on helping you to develop a critical approach to internationalisation in your classroom. The training is split into two parts: a first day focused on understanding the international classroom and its different aspects, the second will teach you practical pedagogical skills and allow you to develop a plan for a socially engaged internationalisation project which you will be able to use in your courses. The second day will offer a "catch-up" option for those teachers who have no yet taken their BKO or who feel they do not have enough expertise in learning theory.
